Saint Mary's College of California is a private, coeducational college located in Moraga, CA, a small suburban community about 10 miles east of Oakland and 20 miles east of San Francisco. It has a 420-acre campus in the Moraga



hills. It is affiliated with the Roman Catholic Church and administered by the De La Salle Christian Brothers. The college was ranked tied for 9th in the *U.S. News & World Report*'s 'Regional Universities' (West) rankings for 2017. St. Mary's College began in 1863 as a diocesan college for boys established by the Most Rev. Joseph Alemany, a member of the Order of Preachers and the first archbishop of San Francisco. Unhappy with the archdiocese's operation of the college, Archbishop Alemany applied for assistance from Rome and, in 1868, St. Mary's College was handed over to the De La Salle Christian Brothers.

Brey will enter St. Mary's College as Undeclared.

During her high school career, Brey earned MVP honors, a 3-time 1st team All League selection, and 10-time player of the week.

Salisbury University (often referred to as 'SU' or the 'Bury') is a public university located in the city of Salisbury in Wicomico County, MD approximately 115 miles southeast of Baltimore. Founded in 1925, Salisbury is a member of the University System of Maryland, with a Fall 2016 enrollment



of 8,748. Salisbury University, originally called the Maryland State Normal School, opened on September 7, 1925, as a two-year institution to train elementary school teachers to help fill the teacher shortage in the state of Maryland. In 1935, its name was changed to Maryland State Teachers College, and in 1963 to Salisbury State College. Between 1962 and 1995 several Masters Degree programs were approved, and in 1988, the name was changed to Salisbury State University. In 2001, the name was changed to Salisbury University.

Jenna is planning on pursuing a degree from Salisbury University's Perdue Business College. She will be one of 5 freshman on her team. Others will be coming from MD, VA, MA and PA. She saw one of her teammates at Colorado Crossroads and two others at Junior Nationals in Anaheim last weekend (one of those girls is now going to be her roommate!). While she is going to miss home, she is really excited to broaden her experiences by living in and exploring a new part of the country.

Jenna started playing Club volleyball in 8th grade after previously playing softball for 8 years. As she was the tallest on the team, she became an instant middle. William Jessup University is a Christian liberal arts university located in Rocklin, CA, with an additional site in San Jose. The university serves over 1,300 students. The University was founded as San Jose Bible College in 1939, in San Jose by William Jessup, the school's



first President. Eugene Claremont Sanderson had originally started a school called Evangel Bible University in San Jose in 1934 but was unable to make it viable. As a result, he recruited William Jessup, one of his former students to take over. By 1951, with the school expanding and the San José State University across the street encroaching, San Jose Bible College moved to a parcel bordered by Coyote Creek, 12th Street and Highway 280.

Rebecca will major in Education at William Jessup University to become a teacher, and she also wants to coach VB in the future.

Rebecca was a 3-year varsity letterman at Berean Christian High School (BCHS) in Walnut Creek, CA. In her Senior year, Rebecca broke the single season assist record and the all-time career assist record at Berean Christian.

This season, BCHS went to State. Rebecca was given the team MVP award, was named team captain, and earned 1st Team All-League (Senior). She also was a 2nd Team All league honoree as a Junior and Honorable Mention All-League as a Sophomore. Rebecca won the Most Dependable award (never having missed a practice or game all high school) and the team MVP award her senior year. She received an Esmark All-American award in 2017, recognized as a Max Preps Player of the Week, October 15, 2017, and was awarded MVP of the showcase tournament in San Francisco in 2017

Rebecca is a Scholar Athlete (2015-2017), Gold Medal winner National Service Award the last two years for community service, with over 250 volunteer hours per year. 



Benicia High School / Boise State University



Boise State University is a public university in Boise, Idaho.
Founded in 1932 by the Episcopal Church, it became an independent junior college in 1934, and has been awarding baccalaureate and



master's degrees since 1965. Boise State confers more undergraduate degrees than any public university in Idaho and has invested in the future over the past

decade, including spending over \$300 million since 2003 on academic, residential, and athletics facilities across campus. The school became Idaho's third state university in 1974, after the University of Idaho (1889) and Idaho State University (1963). The 175-acre campus is located near downtown Boise, on the south bank of the Boise River, opposite Julia Davis Park. With more than 170 buildings, the campus is at an elevation of 2,700 feet above sea level, bounded by Capitol Boulevard on the west and Broadway Avenue to the east. Boise State broke ground in May 2017 on a \$42 million Center for the Fine Arts, which will house sculpture, metalwork, painting, graphic design and other visual arts, as well as gallery space and a digital "World Museum" devoted to high-tech arts experiences.

Emily will pursue a degree in Psychology at Boise State. Emily plans on playing for the BSU Club Volleyball team in Fall 2018.

Emily was a 3-year Varsity starter in addition to being pulled up to Varsity for the CIF-San Joaquin Section Playoffs her Freshman year at Benicia High School (BHS).

Emily won the Coaches Award 3 of the 4 years she played at BHS. She was Varsity Team Captain her Junior and Senior years and won the MVP Award her Senior year.

Emily was League Honorable Mention her Sophomore and Junior years, and All-League First Team her Senior year. She's also on the BHS Honor Roll.
















SHRUTI MANGIPUDI







