Forbes also ranked Connecticut College 58th in "Grateful Grads". U.S. News & World Report ranked the school 46th among the top liberal arts colleges in 2018. 

















MEAGHAN HOHMAN

Colorado College was ranked as the best private college in Colorado by Forbes, and was listed as tied for the 23rd-best National Liberal Arts College, and as the No. 1 Most Innovative Liberal Arts School, in the 2018 U.S. News & World Report rankings. In addition, Kiplinger's Personal Finance ranked Colorado College 16th in its 2018 rating of best value liberal arts colleges in the U.S.

Meaghan is a 2018 Most Valuable Player, Team Captain, and Diablo Athletic League (DAL) 1st Team All-League for Miramonte HS. She played 3 years on Varsity and was also a 2017 DAL 2nd Team All-League honoree.

Head-Royce / Howard University, Washington, D.C.

Howard University (HU or simply Howard) is a private, federally chartered historically black university (HBCU). It is categorized by the Carnegie Foundation as a research university with higher research activity and is accredited by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education. Howard is classified as a Tier 1 national university (No. 89) and ranks 2nd among HBCUs by *U.S. News & World Report*. Howard is the only HBCU ranked in the top 40 on the *Bloomberg Businessweek* college rankings. The *Princeton Review* ranked the school of business first in opportunities for minority students and in the top 5 for most competitive students. *The National Law Journal* ranked the law school among the top 25 in the nation for placing graduates at the most successful law firms. Howard has produced 4 Rhodes Scholars between 1986 and 2017. Between 1998 and 2018, Howard University produced 2 Marshall Scholars, 11 Truman Scholars, 70 Fulbright Scholars, a Schwarzman Scholar and 22 Pickering Fellows. Howard produces the most black doctorate recipients of any university.

Asha is a Varsity starter all 4 years and Captain in her senior year at Head-Royce. Both junior and senior years, she was Team MVP, All-Tournament MVP, All-League MVP, and recipient of the Coach's Award. She was a 2-time Athlete of the Month and voted Most Athletic in her senior class. Asha led Head-Royce Varsity Volleyball to 4 undefeated league seasons, 4 League Championships, and a North Coast Section (NCS), NorCal, and State Championship.

Academically, Asha was commended National Merit Scholar, Malone Scholarship Recipient, Oakland Bay Area Links Celebration of Excellence Scholarship Recipient, Howard Presidential Scholar, AP Scholar with Distinction, 4-time NCS (North Coast Section) Scholar Athlete, Black Student Union Co-President, TASS Alumna (Telluride Association Sophomore Seminar), selected by high school faculty to be a Prefect Hired by Head Royce School to tutor math and French, compiled AP Studio Art portfolio, Varsity Basketball Senior year, Varsity Swimming Freshman, Sophomore and Junior years, holds school record in 2 events, selected 1st Team All-League all 3 years and qualified for NCS.



Founded by the United Church of Christ (UCC), the university's motto is *Pro Christo et Regno Ejus*, which is Latin for "For Christ and His Kingdom," and has an enrollment of more than 3,500 students. Although the university has long been independent of the UCC, it still maintains a close working relationship with the church as a member of the United Church of Christ Council for Higher Education. The university is now a small private, independent liberal arts school, offering graduate programs in education, optometry, writing, health professions and business.


